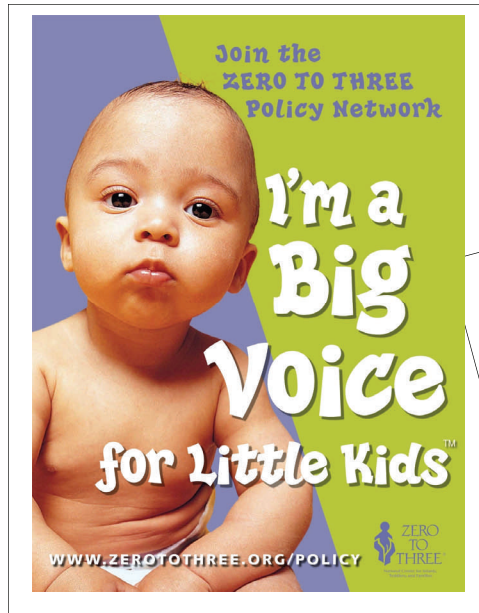


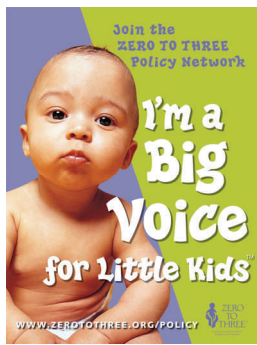

What can I do with the ZERO TO THREE Policy Pocket Card?

1. Use the **talking points** on the Policy Pocket Card when meeting with your [federal](#), [state](#) or [local](#) policymakers. As they make difficult budget decisions with tremendous implications for infants, toddlers and their families, it is essential that policymakers hear from the field about the compelling arguments for investing in very young children.
2. Leave the Policy Pocket Card with a policymaker, or **send them a copy** in the mail, to be sure that they have the fundamentals of infant-toddler policy issues right at their fingertips.
3. Use the Policy Pocket Card to generate excitement about advocacy efforts on behalf of infants and toddlers among **parents and professionals** who can use the talking points to supplement their expertise when speaking with policymakers.
4. Distribute the card at **professional conferences or coalition meetings**. The Policy Pocket Card is unique in its emphasis on infants and toddlers, and can be used to draw attention to the importance of the earliest years across a variety of disciplines.
