




# Hawai'i's Mental Health Workforce

- Our therapist to population ratio is lower than the national average


   1:360 (national ratio is 1:350)

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# What is Infant and Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (IECMHC)?

IECMHC is a prevention-based approach that pairs a mental health consultant with adults who work with infants and young children in the different settings where they learn and grow, such as child care, preschool, home visiting, early intervention and their home. Mental health consultation is not about "fixing kids." Nor is it therapy. Mental health consultation equips caregivers to facilitate children's healthy social and emotional development. IECMHC is nationally recognized by the Association of Maternal and Child Health Programs (AMCHP) as a best practice. -Center of Excellence for IECMHC







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#### **KEY**

If an "MHS" is noted, this competency is related to Infant Mental Health Specialist and Early Childhood Mental Health Specialist. "MHM" refers to Infant Mental Health Mentor and Early Childhood Mental Health Mentor.
