# Difference Between Parent Mentors and Parent Leaders

# Parent mentor/Parent Partner (Family-level)

Support parent in navigation of child welfare system

- attend Family Team Meeting w/parent
- attend court hearings
- transport to an appointment
- help parent make calls to schedule services
- participate with Site
   Implementation Team

# Parent Leader (System-level)

Give voice to parent experience in the early childhood system, integrate parent voice into policy and practice, and ensure all families have decisionmaking power

- participate in Activity Community Team
- serve on State Advisory Group
- frequent communication with parent mentors regarding themes occurring at the family and site-level
- participate/advise the Site Implementation
   Team



#### Benefits of having a Parent Partner/Mentor for families:

- Support in navigating the child welfare system
- Emotional support
- Empower parents by supporting self-advocacy skills
- Help parent to recognize barriers that prevent them from moving forward
- Help them navigate resources (i.e. utilizing public transportation, going with them to an appointment, etc.)
- Showing the parent that someone cares about what's important to them



"We care for the parent so they can care for their children and not see everything as a threat."



#### Benefits of Parent Partner/Mentor program to the community:

- Gives voice to parents' experience navigating the child welfare system
- Keeps the focus of practice and policy decisions on the child and family
- Creates more responsive systems
- Helps move to a more preventative system
