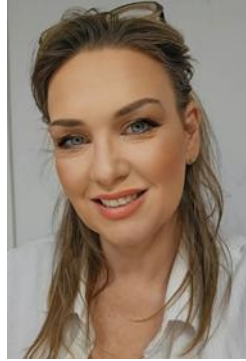

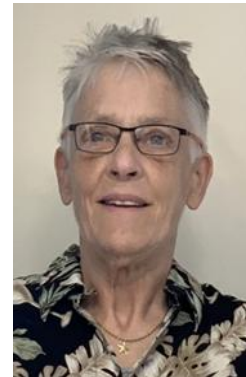

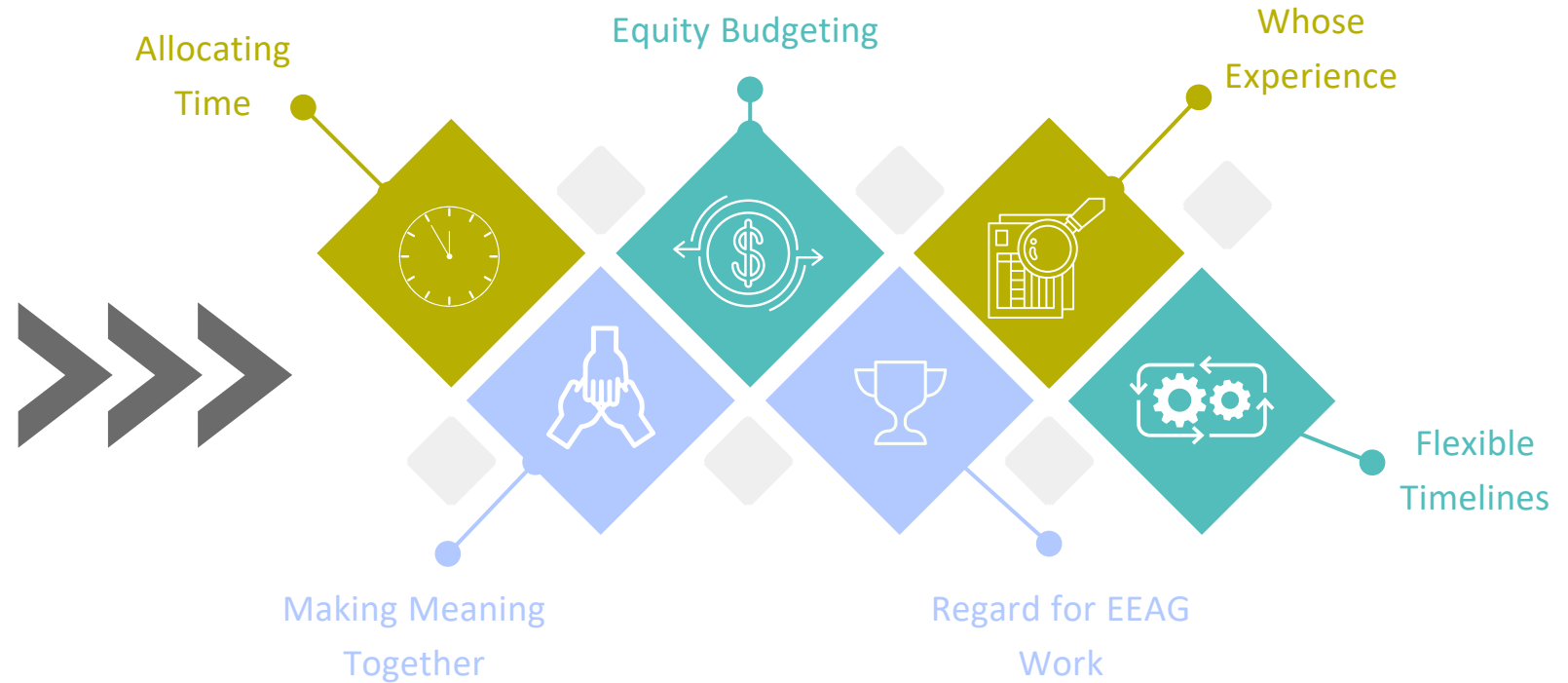
Our Values in The Design

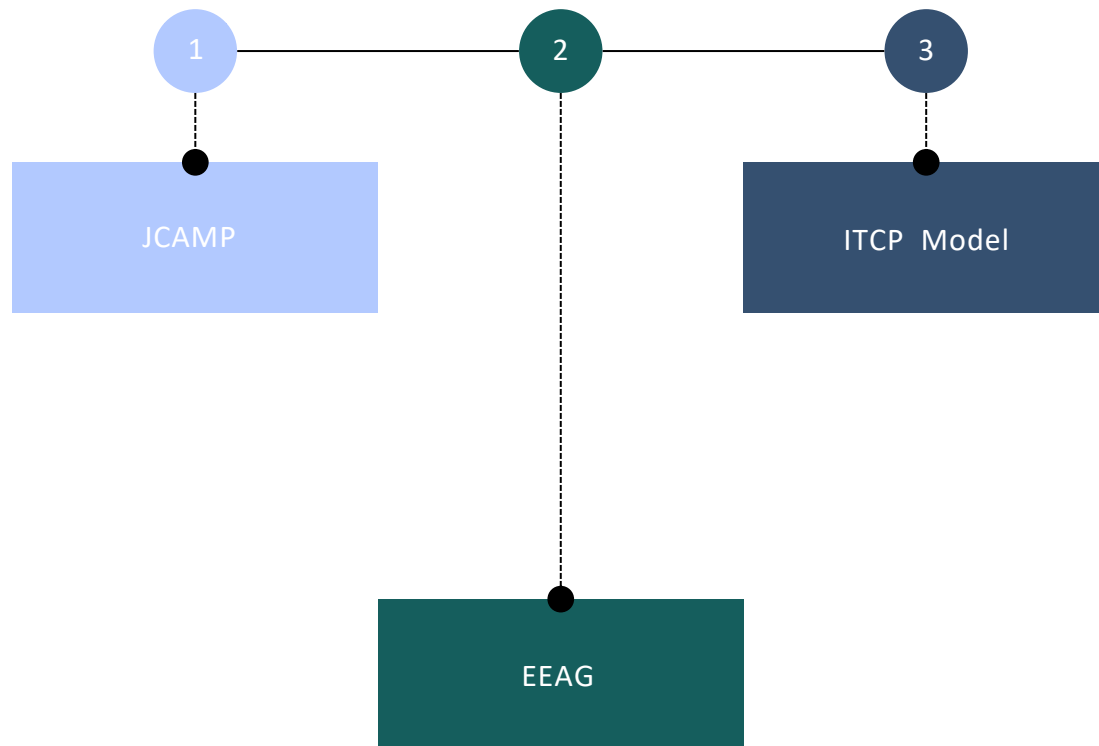

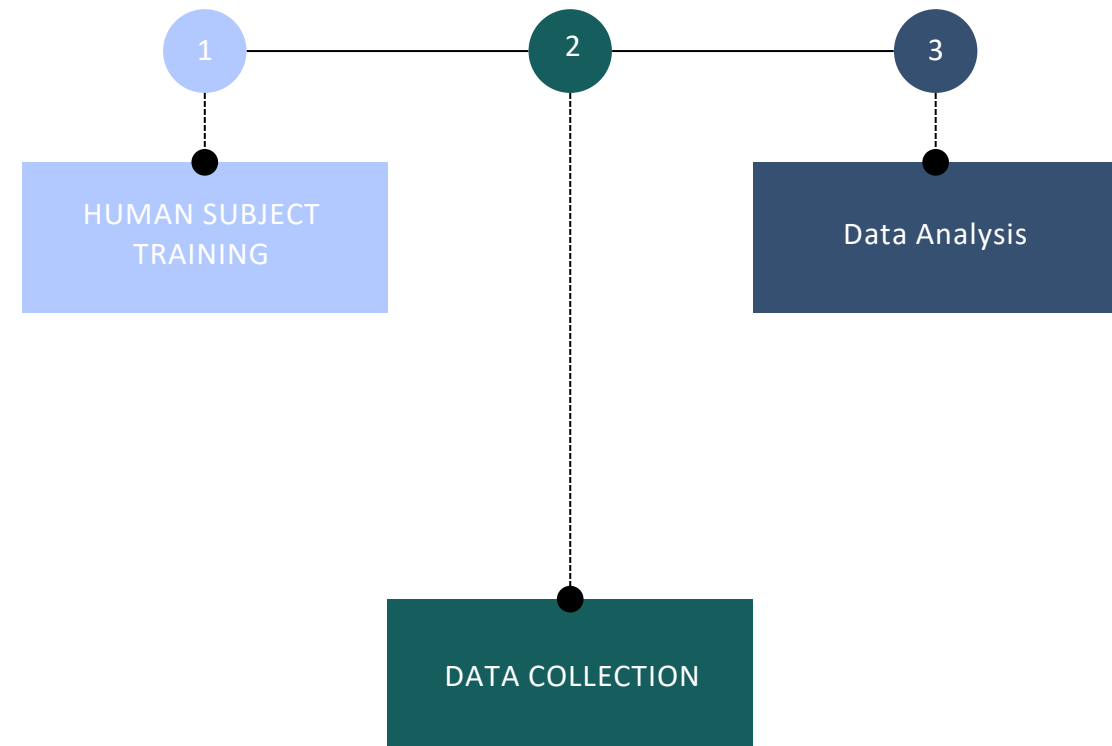

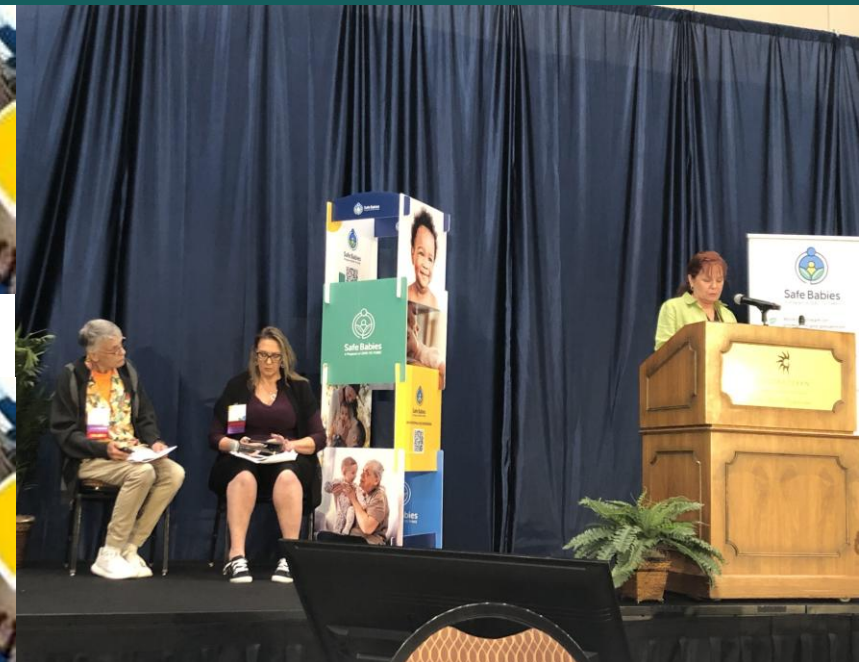
